


















RECTOR'S SPEECH – 2023

Honourable Justice Sanjib Banerjee, ladies and gentlemen,

I extend my warm welcome to each of you, on behalf of the Chairman and members of the Board of Governors, staff and students of St. Paul's School, Darjeeling, to this great annual event.

We are honoured to have amidst us, our own, honourable **Justice Sanjib Banerjee**, Chief Justice, High Court Meghalaya, an Old Paulite from the Batch of 1980. We are delighted and proud of sir's achievements. Thank you, sir, for taking the time out, in spite of your busy schedule, to grace the occasion with your presence.

The Staff reported back to school on 21st February and the students reported backto school on 26th February.

The school year began with the **General Staff Meeting** to provide ourselves with a perspective to carry out our responsibilities with greater effectiveness. This was followed by the **Orientation Programme for students** conducted by the then Acting Administrator. The idea behind the Orientation Programme was to provide guidance to the students, especially the new ones, about the school life at St. Paul's.

The **Academic Staff Meeting** was held on 8th March to plan school events for the year so that all school activities, Academic and Co-curricular, are carried out smoothly.

Staff Appointments:

Mr. Angelo Alva's contract as the HPW ended at the end of the last academic year. He was succeeded by Mr Agnelo Dennis as the Head Primary Wing, a very senior teacher who has served the school for many years. Likewise Mrs D. Alva retired from her service as the PW Matron and was succeeded by Ms. Stella Chettri, another very caring and loving person. Mr N. V. Vincent retired as the Mathematics teacher and was replaced by another very competent teacher Mr. Umang Khawas. Mr. Kundan Thapa Magar has been appointed as a Physics Teacher in place of Mr. D. P. Pradhan. Likewise, Mr. Gyan Prakash Mishra replaced Mrs S. Dwivedi as senior Hindi teacher. The school has appointed Ms. Rebeka Sundas as the Matron for the Senior Wing to give a much needed motherly care to the senior students. Finally, Mr Peter Lepcha was appointed as the Rector of the school on 1st September, by the Chairman of the Board of Governors, Rt. Rev. Bishop of Kolkota, Dr. Paritosh Canning. His induction ceremony took place on 4th September.

Academic performance of students:

The ICSE and ISC Board examinations were carried out in the months of March and April. The students performed very well in the Board Examinations. We had a 100% pass results in both ICSE and ISC examinations.

Performance of students in games and other co-curricular activities:

The students have achieved much greater heights in games and sports and other co-curricular activities during this year. As usual the school cricket teams had a very successful season. The junior school team played **under - 14 tournament** hosted by St. Paul's School, Darjeeling, at the start of the season. The team performed successfully, lost only to Baga Jatin Das club Siliguri in the final. This year our school won the most prestigious **Inter-School Edinburgh Shied** for Cricket. The school Cricket Team has been coached, every year, by the Trained Coach from Cricket Association Bengal (CAB), along with special coaching sessions by the MICs Cricket, which is yielding great results.

The students took part in various other inter-school sports events such as Chess, Badminton, Table Tennis, Basketball, Volleyball and Football within and outside the state of West Bengal. While the school **Chess Team** took part in Inter-School tournaments in Darjeeling and Siliguri, the school **Football Team** went to Sela Qui International School in Dehradun and put up a good show.

The school successfully conducted all calendared co-curricular activities such as House Concerts, Dramas, Debates, Elocutions, Quizzes, Club activities, House Activities etc. The students actively participated in the Inter-School events and proved very successful in many of those events. The **English Elocution team** won the most prestigious **N. M. Masters'** trophy this year in the Inter-School event held amongst Anglo Indian Schools in Darjeeling. The **Quiz team** won the **1st Gymkhana Inter-School Quiz** held in Darjeeling Gymkhana Club. The latest in the list was the participation of our school **Debate team** in the **7th Clifford Hicks Memorial International Debate Competition 2023**, held in Kolkota Boys School, Kolkota, where our students were the finalist amongst 72 schools from across India and abroad.

The school is in partnership with **Quizzora** Team from Siliguri for providing much needed professional quizzing experience. The school subscribes to their Nutshell book series for training and exposure which is yielding great results.

Career Guidance:

The school organized several career guidance programmes for providing adequate knowledge and information to students concerning their future studies. Representatives from more than eight universities, from all across India, were present at our school to provide career guidance to our students in the month of May. The programme was organized by Student Outreach team. In the same month a Science Workshop, for classes 6-12 was conducted by Mr. Krishnendu Chakraborty to provide greater exposure and interest in Science. The Stratosphere Education Counseling team visited in the month of July to give our students a more personal help concerning career choice. The career guidance was also conducted by the OPA Chapter of Siliguri, in association with the Global Reach team in the month of August.

Personal guidance and counselling:

On 4th May the school organized **Orientation cum Awareness programme** related to POCSO Act, Juvenile Justice, Cyber Crime and Good Touch and Bad Touch for Primary, Junior and Senior school staff and Students. The programme was conducted by **eminent professors and team from Siliguri Institute of Legal Studies**. The staff and students were also made aware of the evil consequences of corporal punishment, bullying and ragging.

Excursion, treks and tours:

The Senior and Junior Students went to **Lataguri** for their enjoyable expedition. The Senior Wing students also enjoyed a lovely hike to Tiger Hill in the month of August. The Junior Wing went to **Savin Kingdom**, **Siliguri** for their outing and later had a delightful trip to **Bunkulung river side in Mirik**. The Primary Wing had a great study tour of **Science City and Bengal Safari**, **Siliguri and Lataguri**. The trip was made more enjoyable owing to generous help from parents who served as wonderful hosts providing the boys and staff with needed support.

Visits from eminent personalities:

The school enjoyed visits from a good number of well-intentioned people during the year. Among others, the **Thai Ambassador** paid a visit to our school in the month of March and organized health camp at St. Paul's School for their students studying in Darjeeling. The Ambassador was greatly impressed by the educational programme at the School. The **team of eminent Professors from IIT Kharagpur** paid a visit on 4th September to set up a **Do It Yourself (DIY)** lab at school. The tie up with IIT Kharagpur for setting up **IIT lab** is one of the most important developments for new-age learning endeavour for the students of St. Paul's.

Visits contributions from Old Paulites, Parents and Friends:

The O. P. batch of 1983 paid a visit to school in the month of April. They were very generous in gifting us with two sets of Venus Water Heating System. They have also undertaken to build a basketball court on the Junior Wing field to provide students with greater exposure to the game. The **OPA Kolkata**, who came to play Cricket with the school team on 29th April, gifted the Primary Wing with the fully equipped Computer Lab along with the OHP for general school use. The OPA Sikkim Chapter came to play a football match with our school team in the month of July. The First Bicentennial Paulite Football Tournament was held school on 27th August. The four teams namely OPA Chapter Kolkota, OPA Chapter Bihar, School Staff and Students teams participated. The tournament was one of the most enjoyable events in the school calendar. The Batch of 1981 too paid a visit to the school in the month of September. Another batch that has made a significant contribution to school is the **Batch of** 1998. They had their reunion at the school on 7th September, 2023. The last batch to visit is the **Batch of 2005** who too have gifted the school with music system to be used for outdoor events. In collaboration with them the school has instituted the **Prefect of the Year award**. The first recipient of the same will be declared today. Sixteen members from the batch, along with their wives and children, are present with us today to grace the occasion. The last batch of Old Paulites to pay their visit this year will be the **Batch of 2006** who will be providing the school with funds to pave the tiled pathway from the Pavilion gate to the main building.

One of the most important aspects of their visits is that various batches of Old Paulites have expressed their willingness to do something for their 'alma mater' and some of them have already started their works. The school is grateful to them for their love for the school and invaluable contribution. The school is also very grateful to the **Batch of 1974** who will be having their reunion, next year, in the month of March 2024, but have already gifted the school with the most needed **generator**, which is already installed and in operation.

Some of the Old Paulites have come forward, individually, to express their generosity. The school is thankful to **Mr. Dr Momocha Thangjam** and his brother **Mr. Naoba Thangjam** for donating Brass Band equipment to school, **Mr. Shoeb Zamanee** from Bangladesh (Batch of 2009) for Cricket Kit, **Mr. Vidyut Jain and the Batch of 2001** for Musical Instruments and **Mr. Sachin Pradhan** (Batch of 2000) for Electric Piano. Special thanks to Mr. Jamsedji, parent of **Master Yavisht Shahaveer Jamshedji** for gifting us with a very professional drum set.

Various Academic programmes introduced in the school:

First of all, the school has tied up with **Nutshell 'Quizzoria**' team from Siliguri who conduct regular quiz contests for all three Wings. Secondly, to enhance the performance of the students the school has set up **regular coaching classes**, in various core subjects, for all three Wings. Thirdly, the school has introduced two new hobbies at Junior and Senior School level namely **AI (Robotics) and Pottery making hobbies**. In addition, the school has made provision for some students to attend regular **online classes** to prepare for JEE and NEET examinations. Some of these programmes have been incorporated, as an integral part of our school curriculum.

Academic and Infrastructure development in collaboration with Educare team:

A new feature at St. Paul's School is its partnership with Educare, for overall academic and infrastructure development. Through Educare the school is in constant dialogue with prominent **JEE and NEET** coaching agencies to set up a centre at St. Paul's. There is an ongoing interaction with IIT Kharagpur for setting up **DIY lab**. The installation of the **Smart Class** is also underway. The discussion is also taking place with various colleges and universities for students **exchange programme** as well as for our students' future studies in India and abroad.

With financial support from Educare an infrastructure overhaul has begun with the **renovation of the Cotton Hall and Chapel** along with introduction of modern furniture in the primary wing and renovation of the **Millmen Hall Classrooms and Rectory Dormitory**.

The works in progress are Rectory up gradation, up gradation of structural design of the Westcott Hall, Extension and repair of the existing toilets, flooring, and State-of-the art furniture for all three Wings.

A complete renovation exercise is being undertaken, in a phased manner, with a complete revamp of the senior, junior and primary wing in the offing.

The school has envisaged two major Bicentennial projects to enhance the overall development of our students. Firstly, an **Academic Block** of approximately 30000 sq. ft with auditorium on the top floor, and secondly, a **Multipurpose Sports Centre** with facilities for various indoor games and sports such as Badminton, Table Tennis, basketball, volleyball, fitness centre, swimming pool, including futsal. The school has engaged a very renowned architect **Mr. Abin Chaudhury** to execute the projects. He will be assisted by another renowned architect **Mr. Kailash Pradhan**, an Old Paulite, Batch of '83.

Things are looking up at St. Paul's with help and support from Team Educare. It is hoped that these new initiatives will take St. Paul's school to a greater height in the near future.

Bicentennial Celebration:

The three-day Bicentennial Celebration is scheduled for the month of May, 2024. The event will feature visits and performance from some of the most eminent personalities, musical extravaganza, documentary on school history and legacy, panel discussions, award ceremony, fund-raising dinner etc. The event management team from Kolkota is already at work to make the event a memorable one for everyone associated with St. Paul's School, Darjeeling.

Thank you note to teachers and parents:

I must say that the year has been a successful one. We have achieved much more than what we did the last year. However, this journey towards the path to success has been a collective effort. Hence, I stand here to thank each and every member of the staff, both teaching and non-teaching, who has helped this school to achieve a greater height. I want to place on record a very special 'Thank You' to HJW, HPW, The Bursar, Caterer, House Masters of all three Wings, Acting Estate Manager, teaching, admin and support staff for their support to me to carry out my responsibility as the Head of the School. I am greatly indebted to all of my staff for their loyalty and dedication to carry on the legacy of St. Paul's.

Special word of appreciation to Mr. Punam Lama, Mr. M.C Kharga and Mrs. S. Vincent for completing their 25 years in service at St. Paul's School.

As I thank and honour our teachers, I would like to place on record, a word of appreciation to our parents for all the support and encouragement the school has received from you. In fact, it is because of parents like you that the school has been able to carry on with effective academic programmes, and have come to where we are today. I would like to acknowledge the generosity and loyalty of our parents towards St. Paul's and say 'Thank You'. We need parents like you to make our educational venture a success.

We look forward to your continued support and encouragement, so that we can provide greater care for your child in every sphere of his school life and, thus, help your child become the man of character and conduct.







For this reason the Chapel holds a central position in the heart of every Paulite – old or new.

The Chapel doors were unable to open in the beginning of the term as the Old Paulites wanted to give its interior a new look. 

THE BICENTENNIAL MAJOR PRODUCTION 2023 Rabindranath Tagore's KABULIWALA – THE FORGOTTEN STORY

Adapted and Directed – by Mr. Goutam Bhattacharyya

The play as heralded in its synopsis reads "The well known story, Kabuliwala is famous for its depiction of eternal fatherhood and friendship between an Afghan and a little Bengali girl from Calcutta breaking international boundaries highlighting the beauty of the statement: Vasu dhaiva Kutumbakam"

Before I wander into the broad strokes of the play and its nuances, it would be remiss not to acknowledge the plays's inspirational force: Mrs. Prama Bhattacharyya was the inspiration behind the idea that this play that ought to be enlivened here in the School, we would discuss this for years till this year its idée fixe was realized. What a joyous moment it was when Mr. G. Bhattacharyya confirmed that he would be taking up the school play and doing Kabuliwala.

The play as all signature plays of Goutam Bhattacharyya are the triune of music, ambience, and movement: this was sublimely realized with the beautiful textured music that gave the foretaste of the play's aesthetic reality. The ambience was conveyed by the layered set- a transportation to a Old Calcutta via Shantiniketan – the wall murals, the ochre colored walls, the resplendent batik that threw the stage into a multi-dimensional prism of Tagorean varnish- that continually underlined the play's movement.

The play toured its movement in Two acts, and eight short scenes, its tone and texture true to the Tagorean form that the actors imbibe the heart of the story that they convey- this was spectacularly with the cast composition: The Kabuliwala was played by Sk. Habib ur Rahman – his strains of Kaju Kishmish can still be resonate within the Prep Hall, and was echoed throughout the school thereafter, a mature and insightfully presented and brought out – the character was instantly beloved and connected to the audience especially the children of the junior and primary wing. The next actor that brought joy was Mini played by Varannya Basnet, he danced, and took our collective breath away with the sheer innocence and carefree way in which he portrayed Mini- for which he awarded the most promising Actor Medal on Speech Day, a special recognition of his mesmerizing performance.

Rakshyak Dahal play Mini'a father, a consummate and smooth portrayal, that brought to life the complicated and difficult juxtaposition of fatherhood, and traditional values that had to be maneuvered. Dahal gave a sensitive and dialectical rendition of fatherhood, that held the audience captive and in rapt attention. Mini's mother was played by Shubhayu Pramanik, that stole the show for the realistic portrayal, what wonderful costume arrangement by Mrs. Bhattacharyya and Mrs. Mandal to make him look so realistic!!

The two friends played by Raiyan Chowdhury and Atulya Koirala was a good blend of cosmopolitan understanding that Tagore always strove to achieve bi=both in his plays and in life.

The Director masterfully brought out the political tensions by inter fusing in the play plot the tensions that were rife during the freedom struggle, and placed the play in the foreground of both national tension, personal tension and divisive conservative prejudice that is overcome by the eternal bond of fatherhood.

Mr. Bhattacharyya, the masterful director as always brought to life the story – that simply stands as a tribute to timeless bond between fathers and daughters- of love, loyalty, and friendship.

The play would be incomplete without the army of its cast of actors that supported the main cast, and the legion that make the backstage- the Art Department with Mr. C. Lepcha that brought the visual sense alive with the stage, Mrs. M. Mandal who choreographed the dance scenes, Mr. P. Tamang at the piano, the costumes and make-up team of Mrs. Dennis, Mrs. Vincent, Mrs. Chettri, Ms. Sundas, Mrs. Rai. The devoted and time consuming work of the stage hands, prompters, and managers.

In years to come this Production will be remembered as Mr. Andre Lefevere , Vice – Principal, St. Joseph's School ,Guest of Honor said – a takeaway of the years of skillful mastery that was displayed, the intricate voices, and texture that pivoted the plot and the music and set that gave the brace and was the touch of genius – this is what years of experience, honed to perfection brings – to retain its magic ,and continue its rhythm is challenge and the tradition that we need to maintain.

"Let us not forget our inner voices, the dancing child in our hearts – who sets us free – and fills us with delight..."



PRIMARY WING REPORT - 2023

Resilience is what St. Paul's School, Darjeeling is made up of and it is evident from the fact that the institution has withstood the testament of two hundred years with all the ups and downs that the world has thrown at it.

And this year was no different: a new head, in the name of Mr. Agnelo Dennis, was appointed to replace the outgoing person; education fares were held to showcase the institution as the idle place for a student to study in as a boarder; admission drives were conducted to take the school to the parents who otherwise are unable to come to us; gradual upliftment of the primary wing was worked on and the academic affairs was improved upon. All this and much more was done in order to take the school forward. It was a good start to re-strengthen our foundation like all great institutions need to from time to time.

The results of which began to show almost immediately: the number of students from forty four last year increased to fifty seven this year; both dormitories became operational and a new matron in Mrs Stell Chettri was appointed; an additional section in class five was opened; a new teacher in Mrs. Namrata Pradhan, was appointed; the library that was defunct became operational with Mrs. Pramila Gurung supervising and Mrs. Ritu Chettri as the helper; a new computer laboratory with new sets of computers was made operational with help from the old boys of the institution (Kolkata Chapter); the dining hall was refurbished; new furniture (PopCorn) was installed in all the class rooms; blowers were installed in the dormitories to keep the children warm; a new water geyser was installed to provide the students with hot water by the old boys of the institution (Batch of 83): the menu was worked on to provide the students with a more nutritious diet and many other negligible issues and areas were addressed.

In the academic area, we increased the 'Prep' time from one hour to two hours; doubled the teachers supervising the prep and introduced extra classes for all the core subjects. All work and no incentives would make the task difficult so I introduced a 'Roll of Honour' for each class with five themes: 'Maths Wizard'; 'Spelling Bee'; 'Corridor Champ'; 'Best Behaviour'; and 'Best Dressed'. The students were given a medal each as recognition for their effort. Also, as a whole school procedure, we decided to award the students who scored ninety per cent and above a certificate at the joint assembly day.

Positives! Positives! We had begun on a lot of positive vibes that also reflected in the staff who felt invigorated and enlivened and it was

apparent from the change in the characteristics of their classrooms: lots and lots of educational charts and teaching aids; clean classes; old, unwanted stuff discarded; walls and furniture painted and corridor displayed with colourful charts by all the teachers. It percolated to the support staff as well: dormitories were displayed with pictures; beds were kept taut; toilets were constantly kept hygienic; corridors and quadrangle were kept clean and litter free; the dining hall was neat and tidy and felt like royalty and the food was fresh, piping and appetizing.

The cold was no dampener in February when the children joined in because they were welcomed with much warmth in the dormitories, the classrooms and in the dining hall. Within the shortest of time, they felt the care and love of a home away from home. They were allowed to even wear woolen caps and gloves to keep warm. The warmth continued with the first of the House Activities that saw every student shed their inhibitions, make friends and socialize with ease. It was through the activities that the house teachers helped to infuse the all important bonding. The house spirit was now enlivened and the House Teachers and students were now rearing to prove their skill in every field as is the ethos of St. Paul's: 'Competition makes a Gentleman'.

In the month of March, we sent Ayan Chhetri of class 5 to compete in the Anglo Indian Schools, Darjeeling, Inter School Chess Competition at Victoria Boys School, Kurseong. He secured the third position in his category. During the same period we sent Tushar Kariwala, Denabjan Pramanik, Abhigyan Bharti to represent the school in the under 14 Basketball Tournament held at St. Augustine School, Kalimpong. We played to our potential but could not rout the opponents. We also sent out two groups of students to witness and experience plays put up by Loreto Convent – 'Once Upon A Time' and St. Joseph's School – 'The Jungle Book'. The students were enriched by the exposure.

Before we concluded with the month of March, the students took the first of the Quizzing competitions (Written) and were introduced to Nutshell (Quizzora) a team from Siliguri, we tied up with to make Quizzing more interesting and fun filled with plenty more General Knowledge. They conducted the first round in the Primary Wing and the students were quite excited with more quizzing. They had some novel ways of engaging the students and the audience.

Like gentlemen of the game of cricket, the Paulities took on the Northpointers at their venue; though we did not come out triumphant, they proved to be true gentlemen whose mettle is best tested when the chips are down and the boys came out triumphant in their conduct even though they lost the match. At the house matches, the players, though

Paulities, took eachother on as seriously as they did the other schools. The matches were played with absolute seriousness and much skill was discovered among the students.

While the cricket house matches were on, the basketball house matches were also simultaneously in progress. Having allowed the students to play with dozens of basketballs during their free time, they had very quickly picked up important basic movements and shooting skills that reflected in their games.

While they were being trained to be gentlemen on the field, the House Mistresses were also preparing them to be gentlemen in the art of speech as well. Training for the English Elocution House competition was also in progress in the individual and the choral categories. On 15th April the competition got underway, allowing all the students to display their skills on stage in front of an audience. The long hours, constant guidance, and repetition helped them deliver their skills with ease and great aplomb. The competition was stiff and of high quality that was also commented on by the Acting Administrator and the judges.

Every Wednesday, during the same period of the house matches and elocution practises, the students were also kept occupied with Cub Activities. They were taught the 'Cub Promise' and the 'Cub Law' in keeping with the Cubs and Scouts' rules; they were encouraged to take part as practices in various exercises that would help keep the body and mind in sync. The various rope knots; memory games; balancing acts; dressing up; skipping and the like were practiced in preparation for the Cub Rally that was held on 31st May, 2023. On a bright sunny day, the cub packs competed with each other for bragging rights. Every student of the Primary Wing was a part of the activity; taking part in at least two events. At the end of the rally, the winners were awarded chocolates. Topping the packs were Kaa,Sher Khan and Baloo .

By the end of April, the students had taken their Short Report One Examination that was based on short tests of not more than twenty marks over a span of time and the marks accumulated to prepare a report. This was done in line with the continuous assessment concept to test the students' skill level in academics. After the preparation of the reports, the Head Primary Wing called for an Academic Meeting to discuss the progress of the children and the ways by which the children could be helped to better themselves. It was a fruitful meeting and the results of which did show in the progress of the students over the year.

Also, during this period, the students took their Essay Prize Examination. They were called upon to not only compete for their house but also to show their penmanship and win the prize for themselves.

Just before the conclusion of the First Term called Half Yearly in the Primary Wing, the students took the Half Yearly Examination in the first week of June. The examination was in keeping with the consolidated question paper carrying the maximum marks for the subject so that the students could also be tested on this aspect of their academic skill and time constraint. We had, by this time, conducted two examinations that tested the students' skill level in both the continuous assessment and the consolidated assessment.

After the last paper of the Half Yearly Examination, the school closed for the June Holidays. The students were given a fortnight to spend with their family. They returned, rejuvenated, from their break at the end of June. On the day the students returned, we had a Parent Teacher Meeting. The students were given their report card and parents interacted with the teachers and the head. A staff meeting was conducted after a few days wherein the students' progress was discussed and need for improvement noted for further strengthening the students' academic outlook.

The second half began with the football season and a change in the sets structure. The students were divided into four sets, including the Primary Wing Football Team. The students practiced under the supervision of the teachers and the PTI. We played two football fixtures with St. Josephs School(NP). Our boys were unable to win as the opponents were far superior in their skills. The Inter House Football fixtures were conducted among the houses; even a few class two boys with promise in the sport were allowed to participate. The season was quite fruitful.

During the football season, the Art Competition was conducted allowing all the students to showcase their skills in art. Also, the second round of Quiz was conducted in the Prep Hall.

To drive away the boredom in the monsoons, in the month of July, a magic show was organized in the PW hall. The magician, who claimed to have learned his tricks from the famous P.C. Sarkar, kept the students spellbound with his tricks. His craft was well enjoyed.

In the month of August, before Independence Day, the students had a week of preparation for Independence Day Celebration. On 15th August, 2023, they sang a Hindi patriotic song – 'Vande Mataram', took the Cubs' Promise and and kept the Law in the presence of the Chief Guest, and the presence of the school and guests and witnessed the NCC parade.

By the beginning of September, the third and final round of the Quiz was conducted in the Primary Wing Hall by Nutshell (Quizzora). In addition to the three rounds of Quizzing, we also initiated the importance for the

Primary Wing to also attend and be part of the Brain of St. Paul's Quiz in the Prep Hall. At this juncture, we fielded a team at the Inter School Quiz Competition conducted by Rotary Club, Darjeeling. We stood sixth among twenty six schools. Ayan Chhetri won the Best Quizzer prize.

It was that time of the year, when after all the Bible readings by the boys on the Saturdays in Chapel and the moral values imparted to them, the Moore Divinity Prize Examination was conducted. The children were tested on their memory of all the lessons in Chapel and on the basic moral values of life. This year a class three student, in Nirvoy Sartre, won the prize.

Athletics season began in earnest and this year the students were divided into groups according to their ages unlike the previous years of height, weight, and age; this was in keeping with the inter school rules. The Primary Wing had five divisions: under seven, under nine, under eleven, under twelve and the under fourteen. Standards were conducted in all the disciplines of track and field, followed by heats and the finals on Sports Day. That we were celebrating our Bicentennial year, we also introduced a few obstacle races. For the first time in our history, we also had the Flame lit by a primary wing student. All parents were invited to witness and be a part of the event. We also had a few flat races for the parents and for the old boys of the batch of 2005.

On Wednesdays, and other days when it rained during the second half, the students were kept occupied with Hobbies, Arts and Crafts; this was in preparation for the Annual Exhibition. The students were taught the many uses of wool as in Wool Pulling to create Teddy Bears and Rug Making; the many uses of pots and paints to make Vase Painting, Flower Pot Painting; the students were also introduced to the dexterity of String Art using fine silk thread; silk cloth was also used to make stuffed cushions; also, paint was put to use in Abstract Art by the students. The students were not limited to the mentioned Hobbies: they also used their ideas to create various models, everyday used objects and decorative items using throwaway materials. The Annual Exhibition was inaugurated by the Rector on 14th October, 2023 and opened to students, parents, guests and teachers upto 16th October, 2023.

For the first time in the Primary Wing, the Gal Gregory Maths Prize was also introduced and Ishan Kumar of class 5 was the winner. We also initiated a process of judging the Jyoti Kundu Medal in the Primary Wing: the candidates were judges on their all round contribution based on a points system. The winner was Ayan Chhetr of class 5. We also introduced the good conduct medal in class fives.

On 17th October, 2023, we had our Annual Speech Day and Prize Distribution. The chief guest was our very own, Chief Justice Mr. S. Bannerjee from the batch of 1980. The Rector read out his speech for the year gone by and for the time to come, outlining the future of the institution. Certificates and medals were given to students in various categories. The Chief Guest left us with his message on St. Paul's School, wishing us every success. With the vote of thanks and lunch at the Rectory Lawn, we broke for the Puja Break.

Over the the Puja Break the students were also educated on the need to help the needy. CINI, an NGO based out of Kolkata took the initiate to impart their work and how they touch the lives of countless number of children who are in need of our help. CINI forms were given to students to also feel the need to help the underprivileged children. With the help of their parents the children were able to contribute a good amount. CINI gave away awards to the children in the form of medals, certificates, stationery, frisbee, and football as a token of their appreciation.

We began the Final Term on 30th October,2023 with a Parent Teacher Meeting. This was the second PTM. The very next day we started the preparation for the Carol Service. On 1st November, we had our Academic Staff Meeting to initiate the need for the students to do well in the Final Examination. On 4 th November, 2023 we began the Marathon season and concluded with it on 11th November, 2023. For the first time Marathon was held in the month of November in St. Paul's . During this season, I had to go on leave due to the demise of my brother. In my absence, Mr. Bhupendra Tamang coordinated the affairs of the wing along with the house teachers and the teacher on duty. I place on record my sincere thank you to them for their dedication to the Primary Wing.

On 10th November, 2023 the school had its photographs for the year taken that would be used for the school chronicle.

Diwali was celebrated on 12th November,2023. The entire Primary Wing was decorated with lights and 'dihas'. The students were distributed with a gift each and sweets. The school took a pledge to keep the environment clean and we have kept to it by not burning or bursting firecrackers. This was our contribution to preserving the earth for the future generations.

On 10th November, the official photographs were taken for the chronicle that would be used to record the students of the school and the events for the year.

On 13th November, the Final P.T competition was conducted with the Rector as the Chief Guest for the day. At lunch the Rector announced the results. We were blessed also to have the Board Member in our midst:

Mr. N.R. Pradhan. After lunch the Rector and Mr. N. R. Pradhan inspected the Primary Wing and took stock of the development that is needed in the wing.

On 14th November, we celebrated Children's Day. The teachers performed dances, songs and fashion show for the students. The HPW also presented himself as the standup comedian, bringing laughter into the little hearts. Thereafter, they were distributed with chocolates and later they were treated to a sumptuous lunch and tea.

The Final Examination started on 17th November and carried on till the 22nd November, 2023. The students were constantly monitored for their studies and guided in preparation for the examination. They prepared well for the same and it reflected in their marks.

On 22nd November, 2023 the Primary Wing Celebrated their Carol Service and Going Home Day. At 5pm we assembled in the Chapel where we welcomed the parents, teachers, old boys of the 2006 batch and guests. In the service we remembered the birth of Christ from the readings taken from the Bible and sang carols. The Rector addressed the congregation with a beautiful message of love and peace in the world. Thereafter, the congregation was wished 'A Merry Christmas!' and 'A Happy New Year!' and we proceeded to the Primary Wing. At the Primary Wing, the years events were announced; trophies and cups were presented to the winners; all concerned staff, parents, and guests were thanked for their invaluable contribution in making the year a memorable one. The Rector also addressed us and thanked us for the successful year. On completion of the ceremony, the students, parents, teachers and guests proceeded to the Grand Dinner.

On 23rd November, 2023 the Primary Wing Staff along with the students gathered for a sumptuous breakfast in the dining hall; after which the House Mistresses/ Master gave the students their Christmas Gifts; had the parents sign the exeat and allowed them to proceed for the winter vacation. In the afternoon, the Primary Wing Staff bid farewell to Mrs. Subhadra Sharma as she retired from the School. We wish her every happiness as she ventures into her retirement and takes on other initiatives.

On 29th November, 2023, the Primary Wing Promotion Meeting was conducted at the Rector's Office. The progress of the students was discussed along with their promotion to the next class. The Final Reports were prepared and signed by the teachers. It was at this meeting that the Rector announced the resignation of Mrs. Neena Sinha and its acceptance. That Mrs. Neena Sinha requested to be allowed to leave for her winter vacation

on 30th November,2023, we had a felicitation ceremony for her at the meeting that was held at 12.30pm in the Lecture Hall on 29th itself. We wish Mrs. Neena Sinha every happiness as she ventures into her retirement from St. Paul's, Darjeeling and takes on other initiatives.

My tenure as the Head of the Primary wing came to an end on 30th November, 2023. The school has entrusted me with the responsibility of the Senior Master's Post starting from 1st December, 2023.

As I bring my report to a close, I take the opportunity to place on record my gratitude to all the staff of the Primary Wing for their commitment to their job. I was fortunate to have worked with them and in doing so I gained immensely from their expertise; they were ever so gracious in making my work lighter. I would also like to place on record my gratefulness to the staff of the Junior and Senior Wings who were always warm in accepting to help the Primary Wing out with all our programmes. In this regard I would like to thank the Head Junior Wing for being cooperative and releasing the staff.


















DEBATING SOCIETY REPORT 2023


Besides the elocution, the event consisted of many musical dance performances by the students of Mount Hermon.



The Hobby captured the thrill of sporting competitions, the determination of athletes, and the camaraderie among participants.



THINKONOMICS REPORT 2023

The sixth edition of the Inter-School Lecture Series on Economics, themed 'Beyond Pandemic: Opportunities and Challenges,' proved to be a resounding success, shedding light on the intricate economic landscape that has emerged in the wake of global disruptions. Held on 29th of May, 2023 at the Prep Hall, the event brought together students of over 14 schools, educators, and teaching professionals for insightful discussions on the post-pandemic economic impacts.

The major credit for the grand success of this edition of the Thinkonomics lecture series goes to the speaker of the event, Associate Professor Dr. Prasun Bhattacharjee. Dr. Prasun Bhattacharjee is an associate professor of Economics at East Tennessee State University. Professor Bhattacharjee was raised in Calcutta, India. He attended Scottish Church College in Calcutta where he received a Bachelor of Science degree in Economics in 1998. In 2000, he was awarded an MA from Delhi School of Economics in Delhi, India. Dr. Bhattacharjee received his Ph.D. from Virginia Tech in 2011.

Dr. Bhattacharjee has taught at ETSU since 2008. Prior to ETSU, he worked as a Teaching Assistant and Graduate Student Instructor at Virginia Tech. At ETSU, Dr. Bhattacharjee was nominated in 2011 for the CBAT Excellence in Teaching award. In 2005 and 2006, he was awarded the Graduate Student Teaching Award from Virginia Tech. Currently, the courses Dr. Bhattacharjee teaches include Principles of Macroeconomics and Health Care Economics.

The choice of the theme 'Beyond Pandemic: Opportunities and Challenges' was both timely and relevant, considering the profound economic shifts witnessed globally due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The seminar aimed to explore the multifaceted aspects of the post-pandemic economic scenario, emphasizing both the challenges faced by economies and the opportunities that emerged in its aftermath.

The lectures covered a broad spectrum of topicsincluding, Global Supply Chain Disruptions, Digital Transformation, Economic Policy Responses, Sustainable Economic Practices and Opportunities in Emerging Markets.


From basic knife skills to meal planning, the kitchen becomes a classroom where students can acquire practical skills that will serve them well beyond their school years.


The athletics season for this year began in the month of September and was amidst a tight schedule and delay caused by the heavy downpour none the less the season was a very prosperous one.












THE JUNIOR WING FOOTBALL TEAM






